

## ***FOREIGN LANGUAGE GUIDELINES***

1. Foreign language courses (French-FR, German-GER, Russian-RUSS, Spanish-SPAN)

**Below where FLL is typed, replace it with your target language.**

FLL 101 Level 1 (similar to first year of high school)

FLL 102 Level II (similar to second year of high school). (Sometimes a one credit-hour FLL 112, a conversation class, can be taken at the same time as FLL 102.)

FLL 201 Level III (similar to third year of high school). (Sometimes a one credit-hour FLL 211, a conversation class, can be taken at the same time as FLL 201.)

FLL 202 Level IV

FLL 224 Level IV (credit for either FLL 202 or 224. FLL 224 is geared toward the business language; FLL 202 is more the cultural language. (Sometimes a one credit-hour FLL 212, a conversation class, can be taken at the same time as FLL 202 or FLL 224.)

[FLL 241 Is counted for a literature class. (FLL 241 needs to be taken before other literature classes unless the student is a native speaker. FLL 341 & FLL 342 are literature classes.)]

### COMMENTS:

- Native speakers may take a 300 level literature class in the native language. The literature can fulfill the literature requirement in the HTM program. The foreign language department will award the student credit for the first four language classes once the 300 level class has been successfully completed. (Native speakers cannot take 301,302, 401, or 402 classes.

2. Certificate of Achievement: Students have credit or grades for the first four semesters (FLL 101, 102, 201, 202), and have at least a B in each of the following courses.

- FLL 301
- FLL 302
- FLL 241 or higher

Once all are completed, the student would show proof of the course completions to personnel in the foreign language department.

3. Recognized minor in a foreign language:

- . Requirements are the same courses as the Certificate of Achievement with two additional 3-credit courses (300 or 400 level) in the target language. The required grade point average may vary somewhat.
