In 1807, the first Protestant missionary arrived in China. By 1952, all Christian missionaries were driven out of China under Communist rule. Is the ending of the missionary era the “judgment of God,” as claimed by some Chinese and Western Christian leaders? What is the experience of Chinese Christianity in the last 55 years?
